Michael Aerts PLANETARIUM

The Belgian artist Michaël Aerts (born 1979 in Dendermonde) deals in his works with the cultural history of Europe in reflection on its development and relevance for our time. Insights from philosophy, science, art and architecture of past centuries are reflected intellectually and formally in his works. In his approach Michaël Aerts recalls the humanistic spirit of the Renaissance.

In his latest series of works he leads us into a universe of thought. The center of the exhibition are different planets, which Aerts symbolizes by floating sculptures in space. Each planet consists of two halves of heads and suggested portraits of famous thinkers coming from philosophy, physics, politics and art. They represent the knowledge of our world, the foundation of our thinking.

Michaël Aerts draws parallels to the universe here; all planets of the universe influence each other. They influence the positions and determine the states and condition on the surrounding planets. And just as the universe is constantly evolving, as it mutually reshapes itself, as new constellations arise, man has not yet reached the end of his evolution.

There is a series of planets in black pigments entitled Astronomy & Archeology. In the universe we see black holes where time stands still, or a black mass that we can not yet explain another series of planets the artist forms in white and red wax. Wax has always been used as a material for preservation - literary but also visual, as can be seen for example in wax museums. A third planetary series consists of earth from fields where otherwise grain grows. Earth here stands for the material of our planet, which makes our life possible through fertility.

The exhibition begins with two maps of the sky from the 17th century. For Aerts, they are symbolic of the fact that at no time do we have complete knowledge of the universe. At all times man develops techniques and sciences to understand the world in the last. The totality of the universe exceeds our imagination and our knowledge. There is still much that is unknown to us, just as also our brain in all its modes of operation is not yet to be explained completely.

And so every visitor of the exhibition is part of the concept, to contribute with his own thoughts and insights to the continuity and further development of the world.
